# Carson City Symphony Opens 29th Season

### OPENING CONCERT - OCTOBER 21 Scandinavia & All That Jazz

Join a "Scandinavia & All That Jazz" adventure with the Carson City Symphony and conductor David Bugli on Sunday, October 21, 2012, 4:00 p.m., at the Carson City Community Center's Bob Boldrick Theater, 851 E. William Street in Carson City. Featured guest soloist is Swedish pianist Carl Petersson.

The concert presents works by Scandinavian composers, including the well known, popular Piano Concerto in A minor by Edvard Grieg, *Symphonic Dances on Norwegian Themes* by Grieg, and *Swedish Rhapsody No. 1* by Hugo Alfvén.

Also on the program is *It's About Time: Styles for Jazz Combo* & *Orchestra* by David Bugli. It covers the evolution of jazz and pop music styles of the 20th century: Dixieland, bebop, ballad, jazz waltz, bossa nova, samba, and rock. The five-piece combo performing with the Symphony features Tom Stryker, harmonica; Dan Lancaster, saxophones, clarinet, and flute; John Shipley, piano; George Worth, bass; and Lee Warner, drums.

The concert includes pre-show entertainment by the STRAZZ youth strings in the lobby beginning at 3:00 p.m. They will play Scandinavian dance tunes from Norway, Denmark, and Finland.

Tickets are \$15 general admission, \$12 for seniors, students, and Symphony Association members, and free for youth age 16 and under. Carson City Symphony, a community orchestra of about 60 players, performs music from the 15th to 21st centuries. The 2012-13 concert season is funded, in part, by a grant from the Nevada Arts Council, a state agency, and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.

### **GUEST SOLOIST CARL PETERSSON**

Carl Petersson, a native of Sweden, is a graduate of the Royal Danish Academy of Music in Copenhagen and is completing his Ph.D. in piano performance at the Music Academy in Kraców, Poland. Winner of several international awards, including the



Chopin Piano Competition in Poland, Petersson has performed in Sweden, Denmark, Poland, France, the Czech Republic, Germany, Israel, and Canada. His recordings include the piano concertos of romantic composer Friedrich von Flotow, a solo album featuring

Leopold Godowsky's *Java Suite*, and a duet album with cellist Estera Rajnicka. Mr. Petersson also enjoys teaching at all levels. He has taught at the Royal Danish Academy of Music and in Swedish universities, and worked with students in the Czech Republic, Great Britain, France, the Netherlands, and Slovenia.

### CARL PETERSON - LECTURE & RECITAL IN RENO

During his week in Nevada, Carl Petersson will present a free public lecture and a solo recital in Reno.

**The lecture**, on the life and music of composer Leopold Godowsky, will be on **Tues.**, **Oct. 16**, 12:00 to 1:00 p.m., in Nightingale Concert Hall at UNR, 1335 N. Virginia Street. It includes visuals and live piano performance. This free program is sponsored by the C.C. Symphony Association and UNR Dept. of Music, and is funded in part by a grant from Nevada Humanities.

**The recital**, featuring works by Beethoven and Scandinavian composers, will be on **Friday, Oct. 19**, 7:00 p.m., at the Steinway Piano Gallery, 500 E. Moana Lane.
