The Carson City Symphony, conducted by David Bugli, will perform "A Celebration in Two Sharps" on Sunday, April 28, 2013, 4:00 p.m., at the Carson City Community Center's Bob Boldrick Theater, 851 E. William Street in Carson City. Guest soloist Stephen Framil will play the Cello Concerto by Antonín Dvořák.



The program also features Wagner's Overture to "Rienzi" and Schubert's "Unfinished" Symphony. All three compositions are associated with keys having two sharps, D major and B minor.

Tickets are \$15 general admission; \$12 for seniors, students, and Symphony Association members; and free for youth age 16 and under. Tickets are on sale at Play Your Own Music in the Carson Mall, online at CCSymphony.com, by mail (see p. 2), or at the door.

Solution begins at 3:00 p.m. in the lobby. This multi-instrument duo - John and Wendy Andrews - brings a mixture of original tunes and covers,

including folk, bluegrass, rock, and oldies.

The audience is also invited to a Meetthe-Soloist concert preview in the Sierra Room at 3:15 p.m. The preview, hosted by Conductor David Bugli, will include discussions with Dr. Framil about the

music and composers. Preview admission is free, no reservations required.

Carson City Symphony is a community orchestra of about 60 players who perform music from the 15th to 21st centuries. The 2012-13 concert season is funded, in part, by a grant from the Nevada Arts Council, a state agency, and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency. Pre-concert talks are funded in part by a grant from Nevada Humanities.

ABOUT OUR SOLOIST

Critically acclaimed musician Stephen Framil has appeared as concert soloist, chamber musician, and conductor the world over from Carnegie Weill Hall and Avery Fisher Hall/Lincoln Center in New York to the Bombay Chamber Orchestra in India. He was guest soloist with Carson City Symphony in 2004 and 2006.

When Dr. Framil played the Dvořák Cello Concerto in the Philippines, a reviewer wrote, "There are no words to describe the dazzling technique and bravura of American cellist Stephen Framil. His tone, warm and glowing, is positively brilliant. Suffice it to say, he is the very best cellist I have ever heard perform - and I have heard many."

Dr. Framil earned his D.M. from Indiana University. He has given masterclasses in cello and chamber music in Europe and Asia as well as the U.S. While in Carson City, he will lead a masterclass for student cellists on Thursday, April 25, at Carson High (see p. 3) and play a house recital on April 26.
