CARSON CHAMBER SINGERS/SYMPHONY CHORUS TO PERFORM IN CARSON CITY, RENO, & GENOA

The Carson Chamber Singers, a select choral group of the Carson City Symphony Association since 1985, and the Carson City Symphony Chorus, which began last year as a community choir open to all singers, high-school-age through adult, are both conducted by Michael Langham. They have a busy rehearsal and performance schedule coming up.

The Symphony Chorus will participate in the Northern Nevada American Guild of Organists' (NAGO) Choir Festival on Sunday, April 21, 3:00 p.m., at Trinity Episcopal Church in Reno. They will sing the American spiritual "I'll Be There" and, with the combined choirs of the NAGO, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God," "I Will Sing with the Spirit," and "Ain't A That Good News."

They also will perform on the Symphony's June 9 Pops Party concert at the Governor's mansion; the Reno Philharmonic's July 3 Pops at the Ranch concert at Bartley Ranch, Reno; the Sierra Philharmonic League's 30th annual Pops in the Park concert with the Reno Philharmonic at Mormon Station State Park, Genoa; and their first Artown concert on July 25 at Trinity Episcopal Church.
