### CONCERT FEATURES CLARINET SOLOIST

The Carson City Symphony, directed by David Bugli, presents the third concert of its thirtieth season, "Old World - New World," on Sunday, Feb. 23, 4:00 p.m., at the Carson City Community Center's Bob Boldrick Theater, 851 E. William Street in Carson City. Featured guest soloist is clarinetist Chris Money playing Carl Maria von Weber's Clarinet Concerto No. 2. Also on the program are Weber's Overture to *Der Freischütz* and Antonín Dvořák's Symphony No. 9 in E minor ("From the New World").

Dr. Christopher Money, principal clarinet for the Nevada Opera Orchestra and AVA Ballet productions, and second/auxiliary



clarinet with the Reno Philharmonic, performs regularly at the University of Nevada, Reno, as a faculty soloist, and has participated in the Nevada Chamber Music Festival. He has performed with the Reno Chamber Orchestra, Marin Symphony, Lake Tahoe Music Festival Orchestra, Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra, and Nevada Festival Ballet Orchestra. He has recorded with the Kalichstein-Laredo-Robinson Trio and the Nevada Opera.

Dr. Money teaches clarinet and is the Assistant Director of Programming for the School of the Arts at the University of Nevada, Reno. Since 2003, he has served as an adjudicator for regional and state solo and ensemble competitions. He earned a Bachelor of Music from the University of Nevada, Reno, a Master of Music from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, and a Doctor of Music from Florida State University.

Tickets are \$15 general admission; \$12 for seniors, students, and Symphony Association members; and free for youth age 16 and under. Tickets will be on sale at Play Your Own Music in the Carson Mall, online at CCSymphony.com, and at the door.

The concert includes pre-show by the Smooth Two guitar duo in the lobby beginning at 3:00 p.m. The audience is also invited to a free concert preview in the Sierra Room at 3:15 p.m. The preview, hosted by Conductor David Bugli, will include discussions with soloist Chris Money about the concert, composers, and music.

Carson City Symphony, a community orchestra of about 60 players, performs music from the 15th to 21st centuries. The 2013-14 concert season is supported with public funding through the Nevada Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts. Pre-concert talks are funded in part by a grant from Nevada Humanities.

### CONSORT CANZONA NOW AFFILIATED WITH SYMPHONY ASSOCIATION



Consort Canzona was founded by Sharon Kientz in 2009 soon after she had received two boxes of early music from a friend in Hanford, Calif. A lover of early music, Ms. Kientz directed Consort Canzona until this year, plays recorder and harpsichord, and has sung with Carson Chamber Singers. She owns two harpsichords, one of which is played in Consort Canzona performances.

The group began as an instrumental ensemble, performing annually for the Carson City Music Club at the Brewery Arts Center and at other venues. In 2011, Consort Canzona added vocalists, and Ms. Kientz said, "the total experience was miraculous - how beautifully it went together." This year, they became an official performing group of the Carson City Symphony Association.

Consort Canzona has performed at the Nevada State Museum and other venues and homes in Carson City and Carson Valley. In December they presented "A 17th Century Christmas" under the direction of Gary Schwartz, featuring music chosen by Ms. Kientz.
