CONCERT FEATURES WORLD PREMIERE and **VIOLIN SOLOIST ANDREW SORDS**

The Carson City Symphony, directed by David Bugli, presents the fourth concert of its thirtieth season, "Sagebrush Celebration," on Sunday, April 27, 4:00 p.m., at the Carson City Community



Center's Bob Boldrick Theater, 851 E. William Street in Carson City. This concert is an official Nevada 150 event. Featured guest soloist is violinist Andrew Sords in his third appearance with Proud the Carson C., Violin Concerto. Carson City Symphony, playing Tchaikovsky's

The Symphony will premiere Sagebrush Celebration, a commissioned work commemorating Carson City Symphony's 30th

season and Nevada's 150th anniversary, by Cambridge, Mass., composer Carson Coomer.

Also on the program are Bizet's L'Arlésienne Suite No. 2, and David Bugli's Ruby Mountain Reflections, a work written for the Ruby Mountain Symphony in Elko, Nev., in 2012.

Tickets are \$15 general admission; \$12 for seniors, students, and Symphony Association members; and free for youth age 16 and under. Tickets will be on sale at Play Your Own Music in the Carson Mall, online at CCSymphony.com, and at the door.



The concert includes pre-show by the multi-instrumental, eclectic folk duo, Acoustic Solution (John and Wendy Andrews), in the lobby beginning at 3:00 p.m.

The audience is also invited to a free concert preview in the Sierra Room at 3:15 p.m. The preview, hosted by Conductor David Bugli, will include discussions with composer

Carson Cooman and soloist Andrew Sords about the concert, composers, and music.

Carson City Symphony, a community orchestra of about 60 players, performs music from the 15th to 21st centuries. The concert season is supported with public funding through the Nevada Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts. Pre-concert talks are funded in part by a grant from Nevada Humanities.

COMPOSER, CARSON COOMAN

Carson Cooman is an American composer with a catalog of hundreds of works in many forms - from solo instrumental pieces to



operas, and from orchestral works to hymn tunes. His music has been performed on all six inhabited continents in venues that range from Carnegie Hall to the basket of a hot air balloon. Cooman's work appears on over forty recordings, including twenty complete CDs. He currently is Composer in Residence at the Memorial

Church, Harvard University, and from 2008-2011, served as Composer in Residence to the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Boston. He will discuss his Sagebrush Celebration composition at a house recital on Friday, April 25, and in the concert preview on Sunday, April 27.

VIOLINIST, ANDREW SORDS

Internationally known violinist Andrew Sords' performances have been described by critics globally as "utterly radiant" and

"exceptionally heartfelt and soulful." He has appeared as soloist with over 100 orchestras and performed for notable recital series across four continents. From Alaska to Australia. Moscow to Melbourne, and Cleveland to the Cayman Islands, Sords is recognized for performances of violin concerti of the 18th and 19th centuries. In



2012, he was sole recipient of the Pittsburgh Concert Society Career Grant. Strongly committed to the promotion of classical music, Sords dedicates part of his time at nearly all engagements to educational outreach, masterclasses, and community programming. In Nevada, he will visit orchestra classes in Carson City schools. perform in a house recital on Friday, April 25, and discuss the Tchaikovsky violin concerto at the concert preview on April 27.
