

Carson City Symphony Opens 32nd Season

Shifting Landscapes—OCTOBER 18, 2015

The Carson City Symphony, directed by David Bugli, will open its 32nd season on Sunday, October 18, 2015, 4:00 p.m., with

a concert, "Shifting Landscapes," at the Carson City Community Center's Bob Boldrick Theater, 851 E. William Street in Carson City. The concert features guest trumpet soloist **Paul Lenz**.

Tickets are \$15 general admission; \$12 for seniors, students, and Symphony Association members; and free for youth age 16 and under. Tickets are on sale at the Carson City Visitors Bureau, 716 N. Carson

The program includes Symphonic Suite from "The Lord of the Rings: The Two Towers" by Howard Shore, with a vocal ensemble from the Carson Chamber Singers; Symphony No. 3 (*Rhenish*) by Robert Schumann; *Finlandia* by Jean Sibelius; and Trumpet Concerto in E-flat by Johann Nepomuk Hummel.

Pre-show entertainment by McCarran Circle (percussion duo Tim and Yolanda Chatwood) in the lobby begins at 3:00 p.m., a free concert preview in the Sierra Room begins at 3:15 p.m., and a dinner reception follows the concert. The post-concert reception will be at Garibaldi's Ristorante Italiano.

Guest soloist Paul Lenz is principal trumpet in the Reno Philharmonic, Reno Chamber, and Nevada Opera Orchestras and a founding member of the Great Basin Brass Quintet. He teaches trumpet for the University of Nevada, Reno, and Truckee Meadows Community College.

This concert is part of World Music Days, an annual global event affirming the ideals of tolerance,

and work of journalist and musician Daniel Pearl. It also celebrates National Arts and Humanities Month, a coast-to-coast collective celebration of culture in America.



Carson City Symphony is a community orchestra of about 60 players who perform music from the 15th to the 21st centuries. The Carson City Symphony's tuition-free, after-school strings program, led by our Education Director Sue Jesch and open to all interested students in the district, is off to a great start this year. Beginning students in grades 2 to 5 meet at Bordewich-Bray (violin) and Empire (violin and cello) Elementary Schools. String Ensemble, Pizzazz, and STRAZZ meet at Carson Mall. Their first concert, *This is Not a Christmas Concert*, will be on Tuesday, Dec. 1, at 6:30 p.m., at the Carson City Community Center. All are welcome, admission is free.

The in-school string orchestras also are in session. Middle school orchestras have a record of 77 students - led by Jon Brill (Eagle Valley M.S.) and Nick Jacques (Carson M.S.), assisted by Sue Jesch. Carson High School Orchestra led by Bill Zabelsky has 27 students this year. Several concerts and competitions are planned.


