The Carson City Symphony, directed by David Bugli, presents it's first concert in 2017 on Sunday, Feb. 26, at 4:00 p.m., with a

"Celebrations Old & New" concert at the Carson City Community Center's Bob Boldrick Theater, 851 E. William Street in Carson City. The concert features guest composer/soloist Brian Landrus in Jeru Concerto for Baritone Saxophone and Orchestra and Arrow in the Night.

The program also includes A Festival Prelude by Alfred Reed, Symphony No. 5 ("*Reformation*") by Mendelssohn, and Carmen Suite No. 1 by Bizet. Pre-show entertainment by members of STRAZZ youth strings begins at 3:00 p.m. in the lobby.



Brian Landrus, an outstanding nationally recognized artist, was born and raised in Nevada and earned his Bachelor's Degree at UNR. He went on to earn degrees in jazz composition and jazz saxophone from the New England Conservatory.
