Family Matters - April 28

With Guest Violinist Gregory Maytan

Continuing its 35th season, the Carson City Symphony, directed by David Bugli, will perform "Balance & Nature" on Sunday, April 28, 2019, at the Carson City Community Center's Bob Boldrick Theater, 851 E. William Street in Carson City.



Featured guest soloist, violinist **Gregory Maytan**, will perform a Violin Concerto by Swedish composer Amanda Maier.

The concert includes two other works by women composers: *Fanfare for the Family Farm* by Gwyneth Walker, and *Symphony No. 3* by Florence Price. Also on the program is *Old Netherland Dances*

by Julius Röntgen, husband of Amanda Maier.

Gregory Maytan earned his doctorate in violin performance from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. He performs and records extensively in Europe and the US as a soloist and chamber and orchestral musician. He has won many awards, including a Fulbright Specialist Grant at the Norwegian State Academy of Music, where he taught and performed.

The Symphony's 2018-19 concert season is supported, in part, with public funding through the Nevada Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts. This concert is also supported by the Women's Philharmonic Advocacy.

Carson City Symphony's Youth Strings ensembles, Not Quite Ready For Carnegie Hall Players adult intermediate string ensemble, and Joyful Noise Carson Children's Choir will perform a free "Music is for Life" concert on Thursday, April 25, 6:30 p.m., at the Carson City Community Center, 851 E. William Street. Admission is free.

The concert will feature performances by students from grade 2 through high school, including beginning violins; the Allegro, Vivace, and STRAZZ youth strings ensembles; the adult string ensemble; the youth choir; and special guests.

Symphony Youth Strings is Carson City Symphony Association's tuition-free, after-school program for young string players. The Symphony's Not Quite Ready for Carnegie Hall Players is open to all adult intermediate-level string players. Both programs were founded in 2005 by Education Director Sue Jesch. Laura Gibson is violin and ensemble instructor; Lou Groffman is STRAZZ and cello instructor. Joyful Noise Carson Children's Choir is led by its founder, Nancy Jones. The programs are supported, in part, by public funds through grants from the Nevada Arts Council and National Endowment for the Arts, the D'Addario Foundation, and by private donations.
